### 8th Oslo Architecture Triennale

Η φετινή Trienalle είναι η απάντηση στην πρόκληση: «Πώς χτίζουμε διαφορετικές, χωρίς αποκλεισμούς και βιώσιμες γειτονιές;» Από τις 22 Σεπτεμβρίου έως τις 30 Οκτωβρίου, η Trienalle διερευνά τρόπους διαμόρφωσης γειτονιών -από άποψη σχεδιασμού και αρχιτεκτονικής- καθώς και το πώς μπορουν να μεταρρυθμιστούν οι αρχές της ανάπτυξης της γειτονιάς.

This year's triennale is a response to the challenge: **"How do we build more diverse, inclusive and sustainable neighbourhoods?"** 

**Running from September 22nd to October 30th,** the Triennale explores ways of forming neighbourhoods – in terms of design, architecture and planning – and how to reform the principles of neighbourhood development. Formulated as **Mission Neighbourhood – (Re)forming Communities**, we have invited architects, urban practitioners, developers, politicians, activists, artists and neighbours to contribute.

#### **Opening Days 22-25 September**

The opening days of the 8th edition of Oslo Architecture Triennale (September 22nd - October 30th) will be packed with exhibition openings, conferences, talks and parties. Among the highlights is the international opening conference. Speakers include Carlos Moreno (Special Envoy to the Mayor of Paris), Saskia Sassen (Professor and author), and Martha Thorne (Dean of IE School of Architecture and Design) and many others. With a special focus on urban governance, we gather the city architects from the larger Nordic cities.

#### Neighbourhood Lab at the Former Munch Museum

The Triennale takes over the building previously housing the Munch Museum, and turns it into a pop-up Neighbourhood Lab, exhibition space and culture house. As the hub of the Triennale the former museum will host conversations, workshops, conferences, art projects, concerts, local activities and more. At the heart of the Lab is a rich exhibition of neighbourhood projects and practices from the Nordic region and beyond. Read more <u>here</u>.

#### **Programme by the Triennale partners**

An extensive part of the programme developed with our members. <u>The National Museum</u> <u>Architecture</u> features the exhibition *Coming into Community*, exploring how ideas about community have shaped architecture and urban development. <u>The Oslo School of Architecture and Design</u>'s Academy focuses on minorities and less visible groups as a starting point for developing new scenarios for inclusivity and community life. The <u>National Association of Norwegian Architects</u> (NAL) hosts the ambitious conference Neighbourhood Reforms (Arkitekturdagen) that digs into systems thinking as a way to bring about more sustainable neighbourhoods. <u>DOGA - Design and Architecture Norway</u> invites us to a series of conversations exploring the conditions of neighbourhood development - and promote action. <u>Oslo arkitektforening</u> host a series of international talks and site visits exploring of neighbourhood.
